

Ultra Resizer - User's Guide

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Introduction

Thank you for choosing Ultra Resizer! With this utility you will be able to resize your photos and other image files.

System requirements

In order to successfully use Ultra Resizer, you need:

- Windows 2000, Windows XP, Windows Vista or Windows 7.
- 128Mb RAM.
- 10Mb of free space on hard disk drive.

Features & limitations

Compatible formats

Ultra Resizer can resize images and pictures in the following formats:

- BMP
- PNG
- JPG
- JPEG

Size limitations

With Ultra Resize you can only work with images with sides smaller than 10,000 pixels.

Aspect ratio

Ultra Resizer always keeps aspect ratio of your images.

Ultra Resizer always changes the larger side according to the selected output size. The other side will be calculated to keep proportions.

Quick start guide

Using Ultra Resizer is very easy. Just follow these 4 steps:

- 1) [Choose photos you want to transform.](#)
- 2) [Choose output folder.](#)
- 3) [Select output size.](#)
- 4) [Click on Resize!](#)

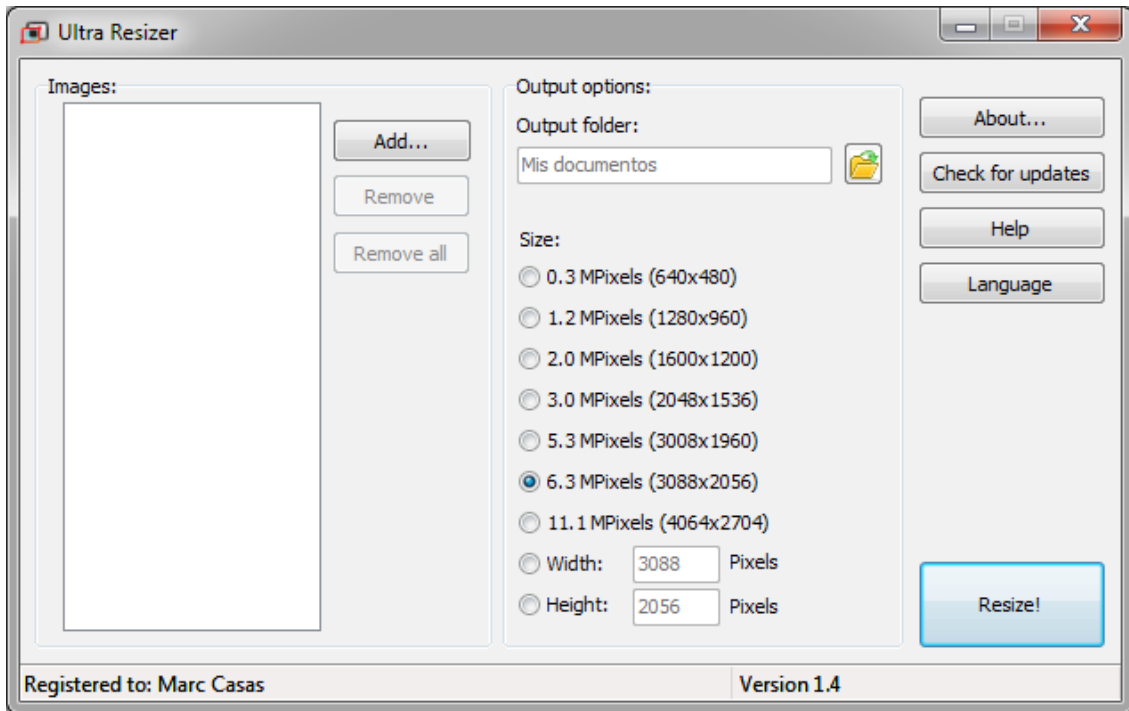


Image selection

- Click on "Add..." button.
- A window will open. Search for the folder where you have the images you want to resize.
- Select the image or images you want to resize and click on "Open" button.
- If you want to add more images to the list, repeat the process above.

Remove images from list

Remove an image


- Highlight the image you don't want to resize clicking on them.
- Click on "Remove" button.

Remove all images

- Click on "Remove all" button.

Choosing output folder

To select the folder for the output files:

- Click on button .
- Choose or create the folder where you wish to save the transformed images.
- Click on "OK" button.

Output images from Ultra Resizer keep the original name. If you wish to keep the original file, it's important to choose a different output folder.

Selecting output size

Predefined sizes

Ultra Resizer has 7 predefined output sizes. You only have to click the selected size.

Remember, predefined output sizes are always indicative. Ultra Resizer always keep aspect ratio.

Custom sizes

You can select a custom output size, introducing width or height. The other size will be calculated to keep aspect ratio.

Resize!

When you have selected the images and output options, simply press the "Resize" button.

Immediately a window will open stating that photos are converting, and when you close the window, the images are all resized.

If during the modification of images Ultra Resizer detects you have any of the images in the output folder, it asks if you want to overwrite the existing image. If not overridden, it will resize the picture (the others will be resized without problems).

Limitations from the evaluation version

With evaluation version you can only select 2 output sizes: 0.3 Megapixels (640x480 pixels) and 3.0 Megapixels (2048x1536 pixels).

A watermark will be added to all resized images.
